After considerable floundering around, speaking to various administrators, etc., I believe it is finally time for us to meet again. You might mull over the following realities before the meeting convenes however:

1. There is no way we can get released time for a Women's Studies Co-ordinator until we've proven that a Women's Studies minor will produce lots of student credit hours (SCH); and even if we do "produce," we have no guarantee of released time in the future.

2. We may offer a core course through the college of L & S, and Helen Godfrey can teach that course if she so desires (not based in any one department, but in the college as a whole); and she may act as co-ordinator at the same time, if we/she so desire, with the guidance and assistance of the Women's Studies Committee.

Given the above, I believe we ought to consider the following items at the next meeting:

1. Shall we proceed with our plans for a minor under the circumstances?
2. If we want to proceed, what recommendations do we have for Helen about the make-up of the core course? About the minor in general?
3. Shall we include a student representative (non-traditional, perhaps on the committee?
