Periodical literature is the cutting edge of women's scholarship, feminist theory, and much of women's culture. *Feminist Periodicals: A Current Listing of Contents* is published by the Office of the University of Wisconsin System Women's Studies Librarian on a quarterly basis with the intent of increasing public awareness of feminist periodicals. It is our hope that *Feminist Periodicals* will serve several purposes: to keep the reader abreast of current topics in feminist literature; to increase readers' familiarity with a wide spectrum of feminist periodicals; and to provide the requisite bibliographic information should a reader wish to subscribe to a journal or to obtain a particular article at her library or through interlibrary loan. (Users will need to be aware of the limitations of the new copyright law with regard to photocopying of copyrighted materials.)

Table of contents pages from current issues of major feminist journals are reproduced in each issue of *Feminist Periodicals*, preceded by a comprehensive annotated listing of all journals we have selected. As publication schedules vary enormously, not every periodical will have table of contents pages reproduced in each issue of *EP*. The annotated listing provides the following information on each journal:

1. Year of first publication.
2. Frequency of publication.
3. U.S. subscription price(s).
4. Subscription address.
5. Current editor.
6. Editorial address (if different from subscription address).
7. International Standard Serials Number (ISSN).
8. OCLC, Inc. Control Number.
9. Locations where the journal is held in the UW System.
10. Publications in which the journal is indexed.
11. Subject focus/statement of purpose of the journal.

Please note that in the actual text, only the numbers 1 to 11 are used to identify the different categories of information.

Our goal is to have represented in *FP* all English-language feminist periodicals with a substantial national or regional readership, with an emphasis on scholarly journals and small press offerings. We do not include publications which, though feminist in philosophy, do not focus solely on women's issues. Nor, with few exceptions, do we include newsstand magazines. We are also forced to omit periodicals which lack a complete table of contents. We encourage feminist serials to build a full table of contents into their regular format to facilitate the indexing feminist literature sorely needs.

Interested readers will find more complete information on feminist periodicals in *DWM: A Directory of Women's Media* published by the National Council for Research on Women (530 Broadway at Spring Street, New York, NY 10012); and in *Women's Periodicals and Newspapers: A Union List of the Holdings of Madison Area Libraries*, edited by James P. Danky, compiled by Maureen E. Hady, Barry Christopher, and Neill E. Strache (Boston: G.K. Hall, 1982).

Suggestions for improvements of *Feminist Periodicals* are gratefully received. We would particularly appreciate assistance from readers in the UW-System with our efforts to keep the holding information complete and up to date. Please let us know about new subscriptions, subscriptions we have overlooked, cancellations, or other pertinent information. *Feminist Periodicals* is also available on microfilm at the library of the State Historical Society of Wisconsin.

Who Cares? Grandparent/Grandchild Households

Based on data from the 1988 National Health Interview Survey and the Child Health Supplement, we compared the health of women 40 years of age and over living four family structures: alone, solely raising grandchildren, married with spouse only, and married with spouse and grandchildren. We found that, in general, women solely raising grandchildren have poorer health compared to women of a similar age living in other family structures and considerably worse health than women with spouses raising grandchildren.

Income Characteristics of Rural Older Women and Implications
for Health Status

This review examines the relationship between rural residence, income, and health status for older women in the U.S. Little published research has focused on the interaction between financial status and the specific health-related needs of these rural women. Both descriptive data from the 1990 U.S. Census and empirical data from the health care literature are analyzed. Gender, rural residence, and poverty are identified as risk factors for reduced access to health care services, lower rates of health care service utilization, and poorer health outcomes.

An Exploration of Complexity and Generativity as Explanations
of Midlife Women's Graduate School Experiences
and Reasons for Pursuit of a Graduate Degree

39

Sharon Larson Carlson, PhD, RN

This study focused on reasons midlife (40-59 years) women graduate students pursued graduate study and identified their experiences when enrolled. Developmental theory and concepts of generativity and complexity were used to analyze the data (Erikson, 1950, 1968; Ryff & Heinke, 1983; McAdams, Ruitzel, & Foley, 1986). The responses of 212 women were coded themes expressed. Results indicated that the reasons midlife women attend graduate school are best explained by concepts of security and complexity. Subcategories of complexity (challenge, change, and growth) were useful rationale for why midlife women pursue graduate study and best describe their experiences when enrolled.

A Half Life: Women Caregivers of Older Disabled Relatives

53

Isabella Paoletti, PhD

This paper explores the impact of caring on caregivers' life style and health. Interviews were carried out with women caregivers over 50 years old. Transcripts from the interview are analyzed through a detailed discourse analysis within an ethnomethodological framework showing how the caring tasks are constructed in the interaction as a women's duty, inscribed in a gendered moral order. A difference is noticeable between family caregivers who describe the caring tasks as the cause of intense stress, physical and psychological problems and voluntary or paid caregivers who see caring as a source of satisfaction and well being.

Early Childbearing Patterns and Women's Labor Force Behavior in Later Life

69

Amy Pienta, PhD

The purpose of this research is to evaluate the consequences of early childbearing decisions for women's labor force activity in later life. Within a life course framework, women's early childbearing activities may be linked to later life decisions. Women between ages 55 and 64 are evaluated from the 1984 Survey of Income and Program Participation. Two measures of early family roles are considered: total fertility (number of children ever born) and timing of first-birth (childless, prior to age 30, and 30+). Results provide some limited support that early childbearing roles do in fact have a long-term impact on the employment decisions of women. Women who delay childbearing are somewhat more likely to remain in the labor force during their later years whereas women who remain childless are more likely to have exited the labor force.

Daughters-in-Law as Caregivers: How and Why Do They Come to Care?

85

Nancy Guberman, MSW

This exploratory qualitative study examines the family dynamics and socio-structural factors which explain how and why some women become caregivers to in-laws. As well, it explores prevailing attitudes about care by in-laws. Material is drawn retrospectively from three previous studies of caregivers in Montreal, Quebec, including 10 semi-structured interviews with daughters-in-law and 72 interviews with spousal and child caregivers. An exploratory framework of the factors which are determinant in becoming a daughter-in-law caregiver is proposed which includes such elements as: social and cultural norms regarding family responsibility for eldercare; social and cultural norms regarding the place and the rights of the elderly; rules of family relations, couple dynamics, gender dynamics and family availability.

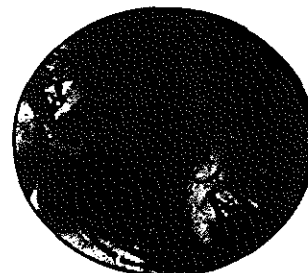

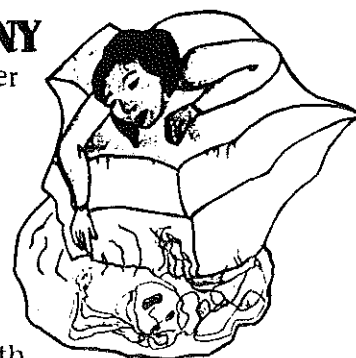

Are Women for Women? Feminist and Traditional Values in the Female Electorate

In this research, I use the ANES 1992 to examine the distribution and dimensionality of feminist and traditional values among women. I find a group of moderate women who hold mixtures of both types of values. The characteristics of this group are compared with feminist and traditional women. I then conduct a factor analysis of women's values and use the resulting factors to determine the influence of feminist and traditional dimensions of evaluation on the probability of voting for female Senate candidates. I find that protection against sexual harassment and feminist identity represent important feminist dimensions, and protection of the family constitutes an important traditional dimension. In 1992, moderate women were feminist leaning and their votes created a large majority with feminist women.

I illustrate the three dimensions: standpoint as embodied in social identities, as a communal or relational achievement, and as an axis point of investigation, with research on the political perspectives and political practices of urban community workers from low income neighborhoods interviewed in the mid-1980s and the mid-1990s and community workers in two towns in rural Iowa interviewed between 1990 and 1996.

Scholars have spent a great deal of time examining the determinants of support for the national ERA. Very little work has been done, however, on the voting patterns in statewide ERA referenda. In this paper we investigate the socio-economic correlates of voting in the 1980 and 1992 Iowa ERA referenda. Using county data, we find that support for the Iowa initiatives is associated with higher social class, weaker religious affiliations, and liberal attitudes. We also find evidence that a significant part of the change in the ERA vote in the Iowa counties between 1980 and 1992 was due to election-specific campaign activity, particularly by anti-ERA activists.

It concludes that the informal requirements of candidacy and electability that typically disadvantage women in liberal democracies are enhanced within a context of armed patriarchy.
