## UWinteriM – It's cool!

"UWinteriM" is an offering of accelerated courses scheduled during interim break, January 5-22, 2009. UWinteriM lets you earn up to three degree credits over the break. Course offerings are designed to include a wide range of classes:

- ▶ popular, large-enrollment classes which typically fill up in the fall
- ▶ often repeated classes, such as intermediate algebra
- ▶ courses needed to satisfy GER requirements
- ▶ classes geared to off-campus opportunities, including travel



### Dates to Remember

#### October 20, 2008

UWinteriM registration opens (PAWS). See page 2 for earliest-access appointment times.

#### December 26, 2008

Last day to register via PAWS. Adds after this date will require the instructor's signature. Due to the condensed nature of UWinteriM, instructors are not required to permit adds once classes begin.

#### January 2, 2009

Fees for all UWinteriM classes are due. If your payment is not received by the due date, you may be assessed a \$25.00 late fee.

#### January 5, 2009

UWinteriM session begins.

#### January 9, 2009

Last day to drop without owing full tuition for UWinteriM classes.

#### January 14, 2009

Last day to drop via PAWS or withdraw in writing. Call 414/229-3796 for deadlines for courses which begin after January 5.

#### January 22, 2009

UWinteriM session ends (unless January 23 must be scheduled as a snow day).

### Something you can really warm up to...

UWinteriM classes will actually save you on tuition costs, because the fee schedule is lower. For example, for an in-state undergraduate, a three-credit UWinteriM class is just \$816.39, compared to \$1,107.85 for the same class in fall or spring. ### Say goodbye to windshield scraping...

The following permits will be available for purchase at the Parking and Transit Office (Union WG25), beginning December 10, 2008, to students with proof of UWinteriM registration.

**\$30:** Permit valid for 14 days of guaranteed daytime parking in the Union garage.

**\$20:** Permit valid daytime hours at any pay station parking space in the Sandburg, EMS, and Pavilion (Klotsche) garages, as well as the Cunningham and Sciences surface lots. This permit is valid for nighttime parking.

The Fall 2008 UPASS is also valid during UWinteriM using your fall UPASS. UPARK shuttles will **NOT** operate during UWinteriM.

### UWinteriM Schedule

UWinteriM classes are for a maximum of 13 class days, January 5-22, 2009. (MTWRF, MTWRF, TWR).



**Snow dates:** In the event that the University must cancel classes due to a snow emergency, make-up sessions are preplanned for Saturday,

January 10, 2009 (for the week of 1/5); Saturday, January 17, 2009 (for the week of 1/12); Friday, January 23, 2009 (for the week of 1/19). Instructors may select alternate snow-day makeup policies and publish them in their syllabi.

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## Registration Policies

### Registration

Registration will take place between October 20 and December 26, 2008. Most students should register using the PAWS system. The system will generally be available for registration from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 a.m., 7 days a week except Sunday mornings. The system may not be available November 27, December 24, 25, 31, or January 1.

Students will be limited to a maximum of three (3) credits.

**Audits will not be allowed in many UWinteriM classes.**

### Class Time Conflicts/Overlaps

Students must obtain, in advance, the instructor's approval via an add/drop form to enroll in classes which have any time conflict or overlap.

A \$50.00 late registration fee will be assessed if you register on or after January 5. If your payment is not received by the due date, you may be assessed a \$25.00 late fee.

### Late Registrations, Adds, Drops and Withdrawals

Any student wishing to register or add classes after December 26 must obtain written permission from the instructor or department on an Enrollment/Change of Enrollment Request (Add/Drop Form), and then submit the form to the Department of Enrollment Services (MEL 274) no later than January 9. Due to the very condensed nature of UWinteriM, instructors are not required to approve registrations or adds once classes begin.

January 9 is the last day for students to change UWinteriM classes from a graded to a credit/no credit basis and vice-versa. **January 9 is also the last day that students may drop courses without owing full tuition for them.**

Students may still drop 3-week UWinteriM classes via PAWS through January 14, but **full tuition remains due for classes dropped after January 9.**

There will be no transcript notation (W grade) for UWinteriM drops.

Guest students who register only for UWinteriM may withdraw by sending a signed letter to the Department of Enrollment Services, by January 14, stating their wish to withdraw. Certified mail is highly recommended. There is a with-

drawal fee after December 30. **Full tuition remains due for withdrawals after January 9.**

No withdrawals will be accepted via telephone or via email.

### Fee Schedule and Policies

**UWinteriM is a separate term for purposes of tuition and enrollment verification. Enrollment in UWinteriM will not count toward full-time or part-time status for either the fall or spring semesters.**

The Bursar will bill students separately for UWinteriM courses. Students who were enrolled in the fall semester and who paid their segregated fees along with their fall semester tuition will be able to use campus services supported by those fees (e.g. Norris Health Center, UPASS, etc.) during UWinteriM. Students who did not pay segregated fees during the fall semester, or who were not enrolled in fall, will not be eligible to use these facilities.

Students who drop UWinteriM classes by December 30 will not be assessed fees for these classes. Students who drop after December 30, but no later than January 9, will be assessed a \$50 withdrawal fee. For drops after January 9, there will be no reduction in fee obligation. Full tuition will be due.

Fees for all UWinteriM classes are due by January 2.

# Register Using PAWS

## What is PAWS?

Every UWM student is assigned a UWM Campus ID number that is used to sign on to PAWS. PAWS, which stands for Panther Access to Web Services, allows UWM students to: register or make changes to their schedules (add/drop/change grading option or number of credits) online; update their addresses; view current or previous semester grades, financial information (fees, billings, due dates), and placement scores; and check for "Service Indicators" (Holds).

## Signing on to PAWS

1. Using your preferred internet browser, type in: [www.paws.uwm.edu](http://www.paws.uwm.edu).
2. When the PAWS login screen appears, enter your UWM ePanther ID and password.

## The Registration Transaction

1. After signing on to PAWS, you should be in your "Student Center." (If your Student Center is not displayed, click "Self Service" and then click "Student Center.")
2. Select "Add a Class" under "Enrollment."
3. Select the term (semester) from the drop-down menu.
4. If you are already registered for that term your schedule will be displayed along with any requests still pending.
5. To add a class, follow either Step A or Step B:
  - A. Enter the 5-digit Class ID number (not the Course Number) in the "Enter Class Nbr" field. Class ID numbers can be found under the arrows ↓ in the class listing pages of this *Schedule of Classes*.
  - B. Click the "Search" button to go to the "Class Search" page to find a class/section. On the "Class Search" page, select a subject from the menu. Then enter the Course Number in the "Course Number" field. Leave the "Show Open Classes Only" checkbox turned on and click the "Search" button. Available sections will be displayed. If the section you want does not appear, it is closed (full) or has been cancelled. On the "Class Search Results" page, click the "Select Class" button next to the section you wish to add. If the

course has more than one part (for example, a lecture with a related lab), you will be directed to select a related part. Then click "NEXT."

6. If you wish to add additional classes, repeat the steps above. Otherwise, click the "Proceed to Step 2 of 3" button.
7. Click "Finish Enrolling."
8. If your course request can be met, you will see a **Green ✓** (success) under the "Status" column. If your request cannot be met, you will see a **Red X** and an error message will be displayed. If the message states that the class is full or that you do not meet the requisites, you may wish to contact the department that is offering the class to see if they will issue you a permission number or signed "Add/Drop" form.
9. Click the "Add Another Class" button to continue adding or dropping classes.
10. When you have finished entering classes or making changes, take a final look at your schedule by clicking the "My Class Schedule" link at the bottom of the page.

## Dropping a Class

1. After signing into PAWS the "Student Center" should automatically be displayed. If it is not displayed, click "Self Service" under "Menu" and then click "Student Center."
2. Select "Drop a Class" under "Enrollment."
3. Select the term from the drop-down menu next to "Select Term."
4. To drop a class, place a check mark in the "Select" column by the course you wish to drop. Then click "Drop Selected Courses." Verify the information and then click "Finish Dropping." If the class was able to be



dropped you will see a **Green ✓** (success); if the course was unable to be dropped you will see a **Red X** and an error message will be displayed.

## Waiting Lists

The use of waiting lists is strictly up to the department teaching the course. Some departments use them for selected courses, and some do not use them at all. Departments also have their own policies regarding how students move from the waiting list into classes, and it may not always be on a first come/first served basis. Some departments give preference to seniors who are graduating, some to students in their own program, etc.

As of the publication of this *Schedule*, we still anticipate use of the "Closed Section Interest" form with a link from PAWS until December 26.

## Campus Facilities and UWinteriM Hours

### Financial Aid

Financial aid may be available for tuition and books for UWinteriM. Availability of aid will be based on the remaining portion of the student's academic year Stafford loan eligibility.

**To qualify:** Students receiving aid must be enrolled for three (3) credits, must have been enrolled for fall semester and need to complete a UWinteriM aid application and be registered for three (3) credits by January 5 to be considered for aid.

Enrollment in UWinteriM counts against a student's time frame for aid whether or not the student receives aid (.25 semesters deducted from the time frame for three credits or less). Additional information and the UWinteriM application will be available on the Department of Financial Aid Web page after October 15.

### Grades

Grades will be available on PAWS on January 26, 2009.

Undergraduates who receive an incomplete during UWinteriM must remove the incomplete by the end of the following semester of enrollment. For graduate students, incompletes must be removed by the end of the following semester.

## Prerequisite Abbreviations

### (C) = Corequisite

A course which may be taken as either a prerequisite or as a concurrent registration with the higher-level course.

### (ER) = Enrollment Restriction

A course which is not open for enrollment to students who have earned credits in a specified course (or courses) with similar or overlapping content.

### (NC) = Nonrepeatable Corequisite

A corequisite course for which the student is not permitted to substitute the grade earned when the course is repeated subsequent to earning credit in the higher-level course.

### (NP) = Nonrepeatable Prerequisite

A prerequisite course for which the student is not permitted to substitute the grade earned when the course is repeated subsequent to earning credit in the higher-level course.

### (P) = Prerequisite

A course in which a student is required to earn credit prior to being allowed to enroll in a subsequent higher-level course. A prerequisite course may not be taken for credit subsequent to the earning of credit in the higher-level course.

### (R) = Recommended Course

A course which the instructor strongly recommends be taken prior to enrollment in a subsequent course.

DIFFERENTIAL TUITION, applied regardless of the credit plateau, for all students enrolled in most undergraduate courses offered through the degree programs within the UW-Milwaukee Peck School of the Arts beginning in the Fall 2004 semester. Eight 100-level General Education Requirement (GER) courses do not carry the differential: Music 100, Music 101, Music 102, Art 100, Art 105, Art 106, Art 124, and Theatre 100. The differential tuition rate will be set at \$20 per credit during this academic year. Additional tuition enhances the quality of education in the Peck School of the Arts.

All Inter-Arts traditional track majors (excluding DIVAS and Musical Theatre) must meet with their academic advisor in the Peck School of the Arts Student Services Office prior to registration. A registration hold will be placed on the students record until an academic advising session is held. Upon completion of the advising session, the registration hold will be removed.. ### IMPORTANT REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- Prerequisites will be strictly enforced. Students who do not meet prerequisites will be administratively dropped from the course, without notice.
- Any student enrolled in a dance course, who does not attend the first class without having previously notified the Department of Dance Office (414.229.2571) may, at the discretion of the instructor, be administratively dropped. After the Friday of the first week of classes, students will not be allowed to drop without the written permission of the instructor. It is the student's responsibility to check the office hours of the instructor if a drop is requested. See administrative or departmental drop section in the Registration portion of the Schedule of Classes for information about fees for students dropped from the course. Note: Students must file signed drop forms personally, at the Department of Enrollment Services; instructors take students off their own list, but they do not contact the Department of Enrollment Services.
- Dance majors will have priority registration for courses required in the major.
- All Dance majors must complete the audition process before enrolling in Dance majors classes. Contact the Department of Dance Office at (414.229.2571) for more information and upcoming audition dates.
- Non-Dance majors: To satisfy GER requirements, the following courses are offered in the Dance Department: 103, 110, 111, 113, 115, 117, 122, 220, 313, 315, 323, and 370. Please register for the section labeled 'Non-Dance majors only.'

It is a student's responsibility to check her or his PantherMail email account regularly for important university and/or course related information (or to input a PantherMail forward mail command routing email to any other preferred non-UWM email address).
