University of Wisconsin--Milwaukee

Introduction

According to its mission statement, the primary purpose of the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee is to provide Wisconsin's largest metropolitan area with a major comprehensive doctoral university. In the fall semester of 1997 UWM served 22,251 students with over 3,300 employees and a 1997-98 budget in excess of 286 million dollars. Given the size of the university and breadth of its mission, the student population and the programs in which they are enrolled are extremely diverse.

There are four distinct groups of students served by the University. Undergraduate students enrolled in baccalaureate degree programs make up the largest group comprising 70.8 percent of the student population. Graduate students enrolled in master's and doctoral degree programs represent 18 percent of the students. Undergraduate specials (undergraduate students not enrolled in degree programs) comprise 8.6 percent and non-degree candidates in the Graduate School represent 2.5 percent. Within these groups there is also considerable diversity. See the Student Profile section for details.

A significant portion (46%) of UWM students attend school part-time.

There is considerable variation in the credit load carried by undergraduates. The average credit load for undergraduate students is 11.9, with 14.7% enrolling for six or less credits and 30.6% enrolling for 15 or more credits. Similarly, the average credit load for graduate students is 5.8, with 37.4% enrolling for three or less credits and 30.8% enrolling for eight or more credits. 41.7 percent of undergraduate special students are enrolled for three credits and 56.1% of non-degree candidates carry three credits. Forty-eight percent of UWM students are employed while attending school. See the Student Employment Status section for details.

17.7 percent of the total student population are enrolled exclusively in courses which meet in the evening. This includes 7.2% of the undergraduates, 36.8% of the undergraduate special students, 42.3% of graduates and 73.3% of the graduate non-degree students. Fifty-nine percent of the evening student population is female. Evening students generate a total of 17,249 credits with an average credit load of 4.4, which constitutes 7.7% of the total credits at UWM. See the Evening Students section for details.

UWM serves a racially diverse population consisting of 8.3% African-American students, 2.2% Asian students, 1.2% Southeast Asian students, 0.7% Native American students, 3.5% Hispanic students, 80.7% White students and 3.4% Foreign students. Breakdowns by race appear in the Headcount Enrollment, Evening Student, and Degrees Granted sections.

Women represent 55.4% of the total student population at UWM. The percentage of women varies considerably by school/college, ranging from 15% in Engineering to 87% in Nursing. Women comprise 59.8% of the undergraduate special students and 67% of the non-degree candidates. Forty-four percent of female students and 41.3% of male students attend part-time. Breakdowns by gender appear in the Headcount Enrollment, Evening Student, and Degrees Granted sections.

The average age of all students at UWM is 26.3, ranging from an average of 23.4 for undergraduates to 35.7 for non-degree candidates in the Graduate School. See the Student Characteristics section for details.

UWM awards degrees in 81 different baccalaureate degree programs, 47 master's programs and 18 doctoral programs. In 1997-98, 2,247 bachelor's, 1,043 Master's and 102 doctoral degrees were awarded. See the Degrees Granted section for details.

Resident tuition increased 7.4% for undergraduates and 7.4% for graduates from 1996-97 to 1997-98. Financial aid awarded to UWM students also increased. Total financial aid accepted by UWM students increased from \$63,287,296 in 1996-97 to \$70,704,021 in 1997-98. This increase resulted from a 9% increase in grants and a 7% increase in loans. 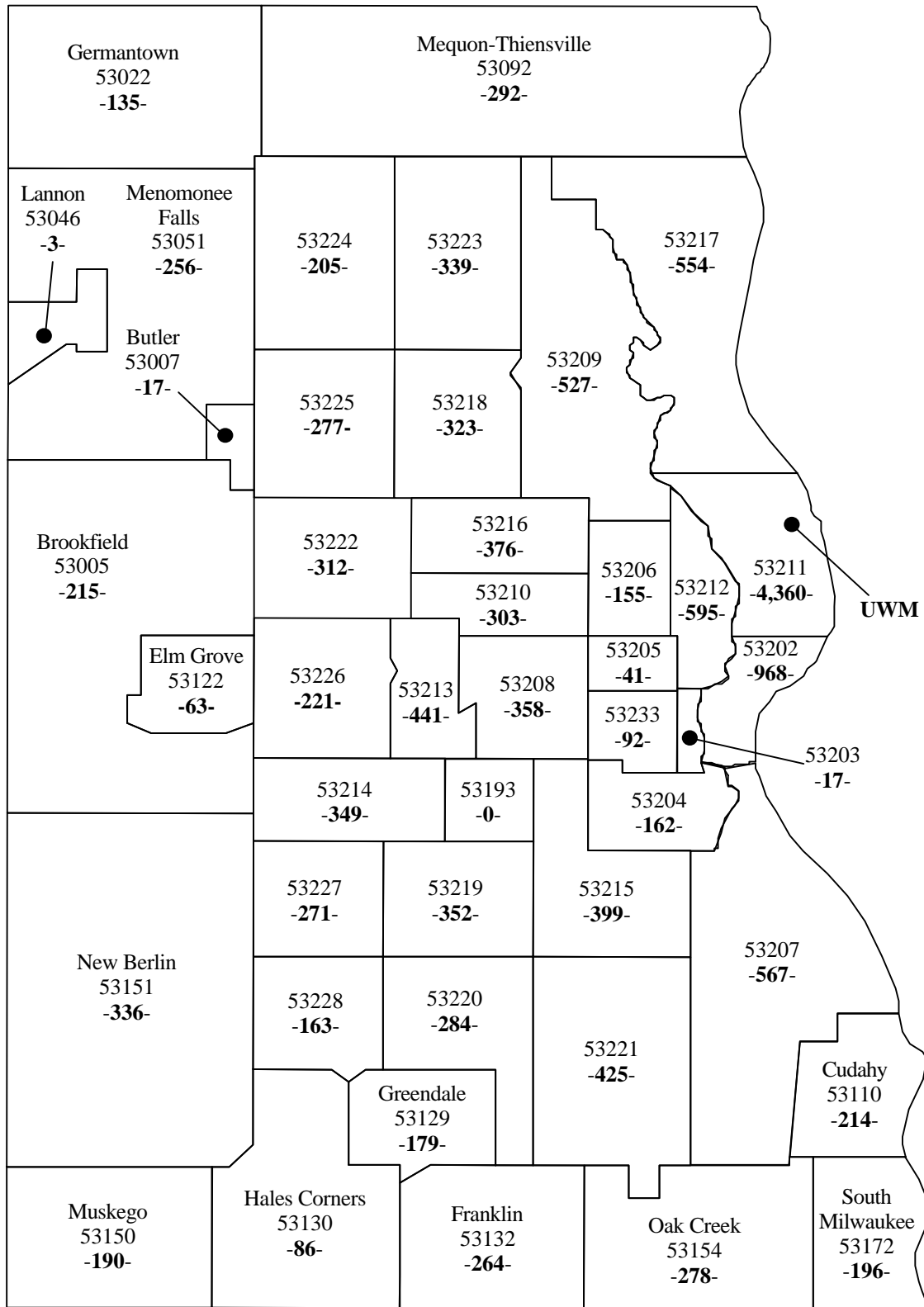
Total funding for UWM increased by 4.5 percent from \$274 million in 1996-97 to \$286 million in 1997-98. 37.6 percent of the total came from state appropriations and the remainder came from student fees and other sources. See the University Budget Data section for details.

UWM had 3,368 full and part-time non-student employees on the October 1997 payroll. Of these 711 held ranked faculty appointments and 670 were instructional academic staff. See the Faculty/Staff Employment section for details.

UWM's main campus is located on 73 acres on the northeast side of the city of Milwaukee. The main campus contains over 2,800,000 total assignable square feet of space. See the Facilities section for details.

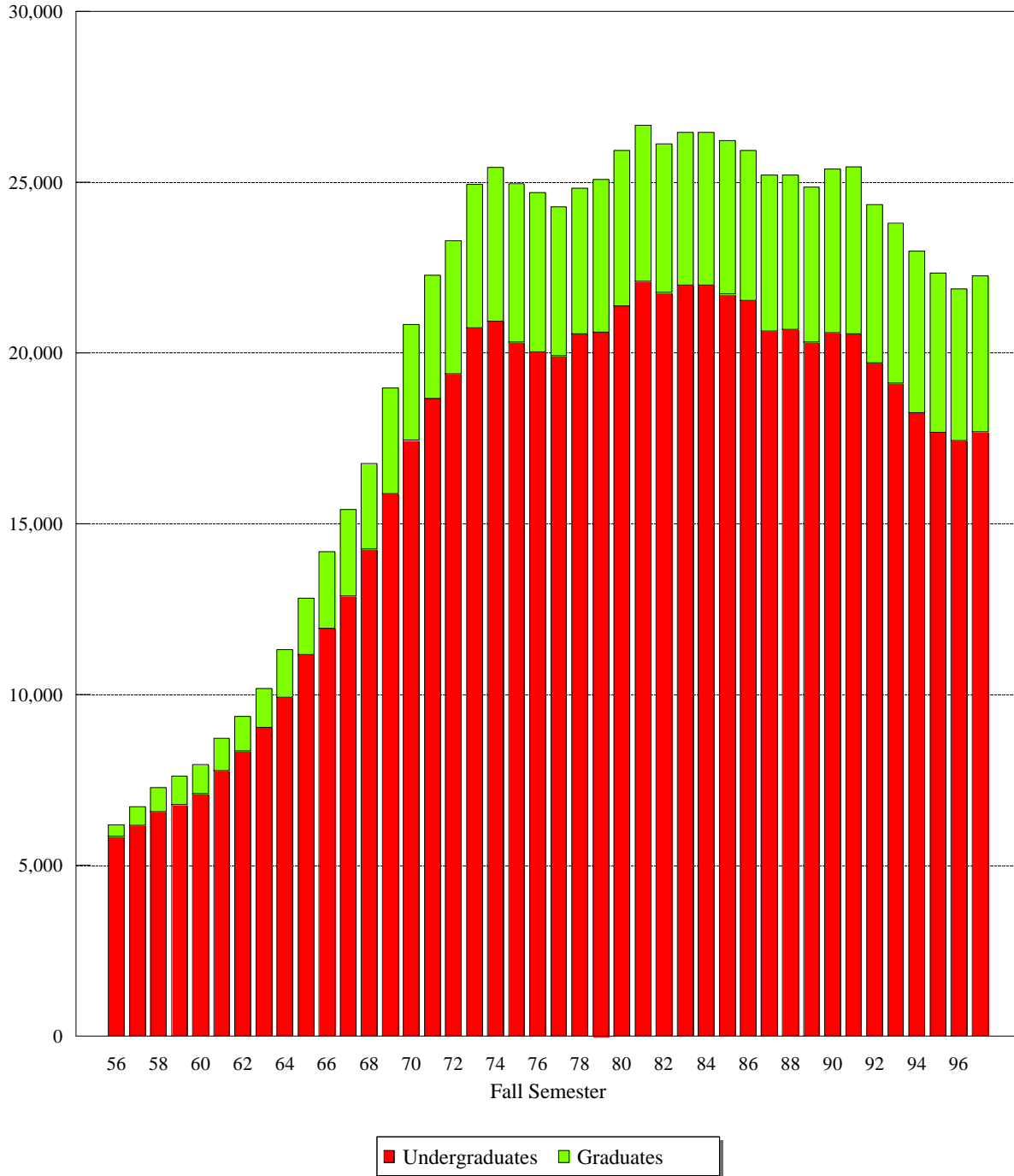

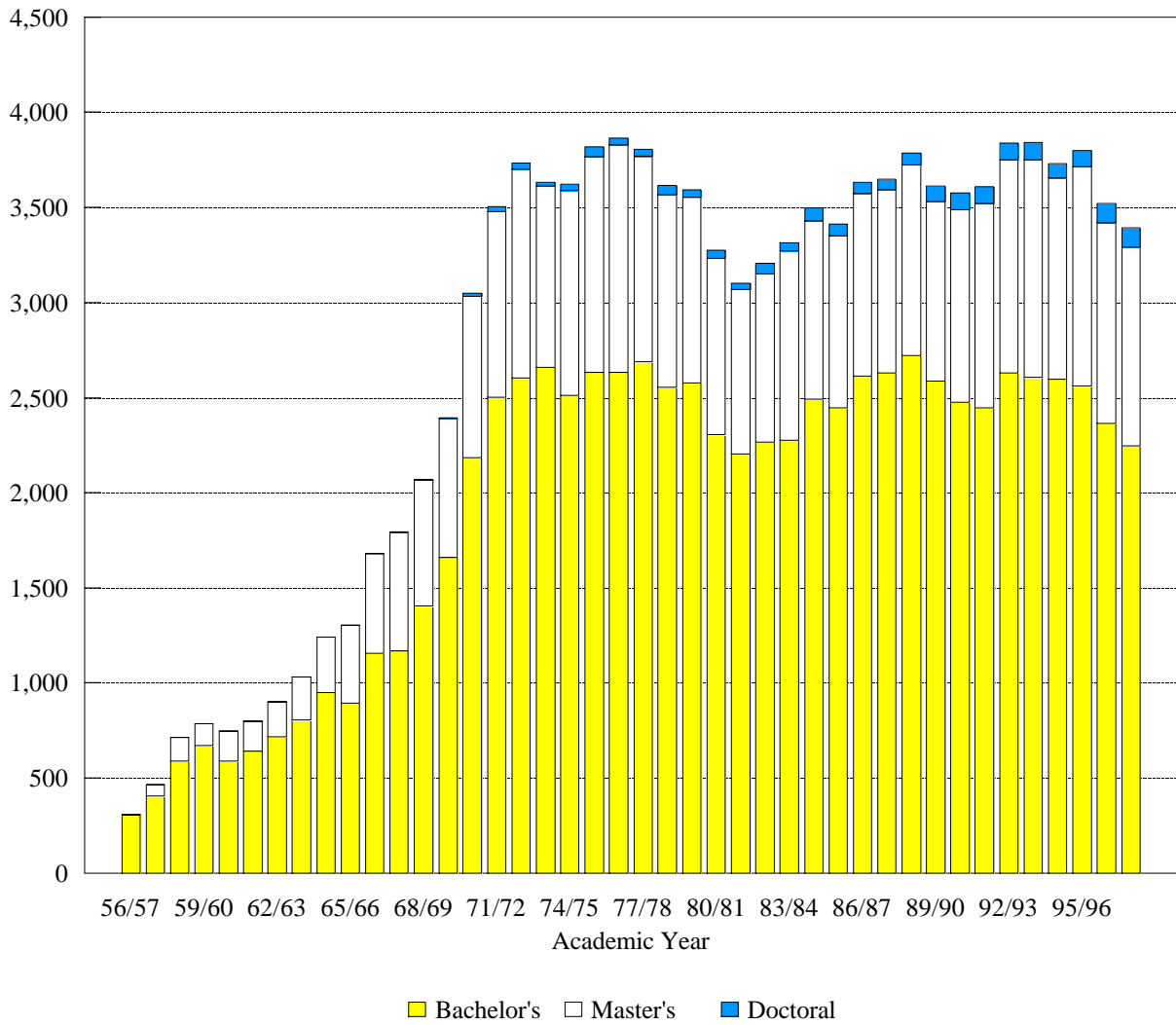

Financial Aid

Grants and loans have become increasingly important to students as resources to help finance educational costs. Each semester the Financial Aid Department at UWM assists thousands of students in obtaining funding from the grant or loan programs offered on campus.

Some grants or loans are specifically aimed at particular groups such as minorities, the disadvantaged, or the disabled. There are also those programs aimed at reaching students within a particular school or college. This summary does not include all of the different programs available to our students but it does cover the more widely used ones. To receive more explicit information about the availability of grants or loans, please contact the UWM Financial Aid Office.

Federal Pell Grant - Available to students while pursuing their first undergraduate degree. The grants range from \$200 to \$2,700 annually.

Federal Supplementary Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) - Available to the student until the undergraduate degree is received. These grants range from \$200 to \$800 annually.

Wisconsin Higher Educational Grant - Available only to undergraduate residents of Wisconsin. The grant ranges from \$125 to \$1,800.

Federal Stafford Loan (subsidized and unsubsidized) - Students who completed a financial aid application may have received a Federal Stafford Loan as part of their financial aid package. These loans are serviced through a bank, savings bank, or credit union. Freshmen may receive up to \$2,625 annually. Sophomores may receive up to \$3,500 annually. Juniors and seniors may receive up to \$5,500 annually. Undergraduates may receive up to \$23,000 cumulatively. Graduate students may receive up to \$8,500 annually and \$65,500 cumulatively. Borrowers must begin repayment six months after leaving college. Interest rates are variable and begin to accrue for subsidized loans at this time. For unsubsidized loans, borrowers pay the interest while in school. Beginning in 1995-96, the university participated in the Federal Direct Student Loan Program and no longer participated in the Stafford Program. Eligibility requirements and borrowing levels, however, will remain the same.

Federal Perkins Loan - These loans may total up to \$15,000 for undergraduate education, and \$30,000 for combined undergraduate and graduate education. Repayment and five percent interest are deferred until nine months after ceasing to be enrolled at least half time.

It must be noted that there is a significant difference between a loan and a grant. A loan is money borrowed from the lender and it must be repaid with interest. A grant is money that does not have to be paid back.

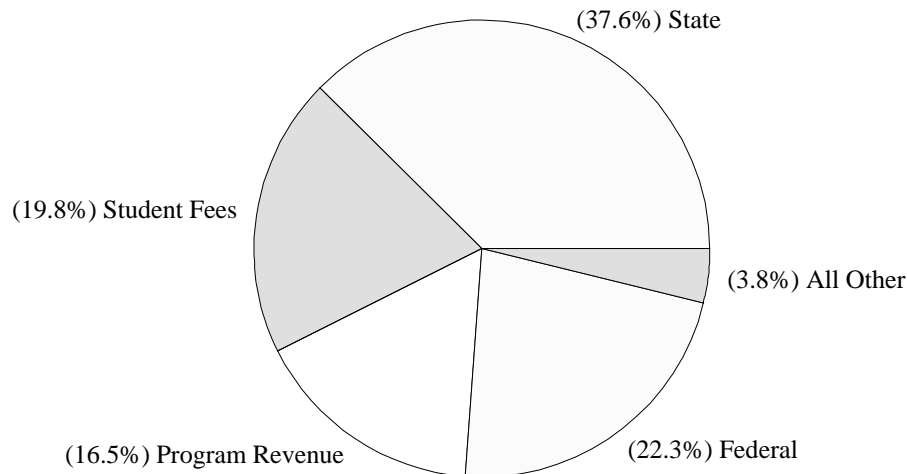

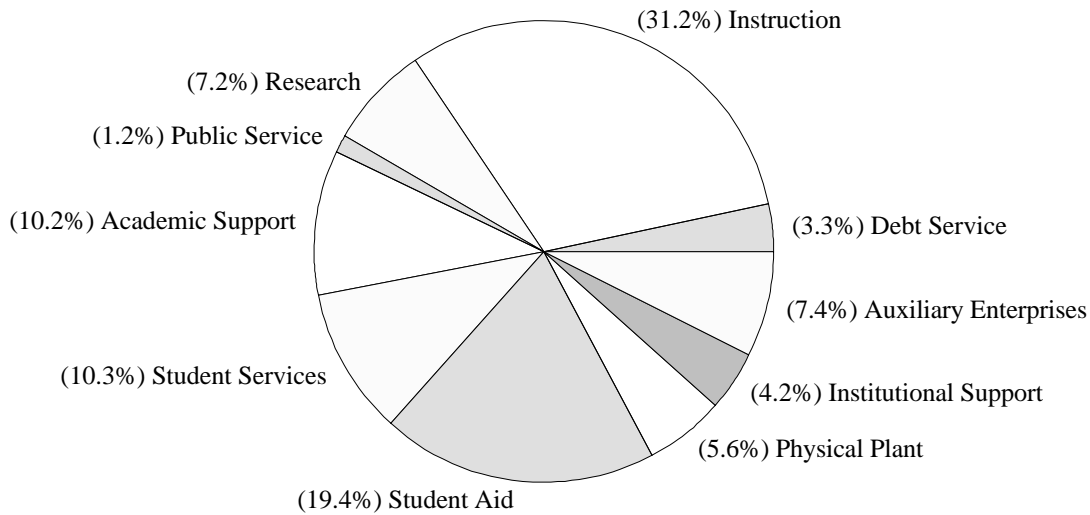

Source of Funds - All Funds**



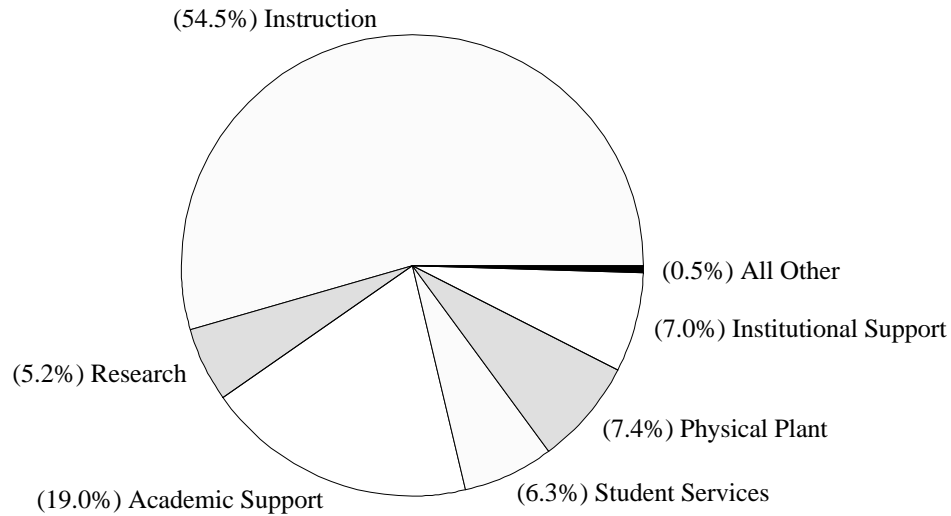

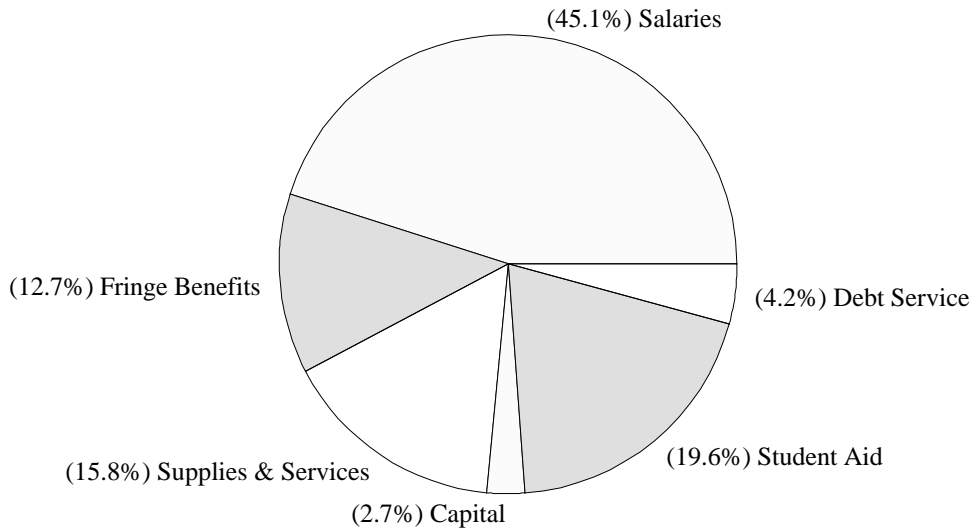

Definitions of Terms Used in the Fact Book

ACADEMIC AREA:	School or college, such as Letters and Science, Education, Nursing, etc.
AGE:	Student ages are computed as of August 31, 1997.
AREA OF STUDY or CLASSIFICATION:	Indicates the student's course of study and/or degree program. Also called the Student Classification.
CURRENT ENTRY STATUS:	<p>New: The student is in his/her first semester at UWM as a new freshman or new graduate student.</p> <p>Continuing: The student is continuing at UWM at the same level (undergraduate, special or graduate) as in the immediately preceding semester.</p> <p>Reentry: The student is returning to UWM at the same level as their last enrollment at UWM after an absence of one or more semesters.</p> <p>Transfer: An advanced standing student in his/her first semester at UWM as a transfer from another college or as a special student.</p>
EVENING STUDENT:	A student taking classes only in the evening (4:30 pm or later) or on weekends.
FTE:	One Full-Time Equivalent student equates to a non-graduate student taking 15 credits, a master's student taking 12 credits, or a doctoral student taking 7 credits.
GPO FUNDS:	General Program Operations Fund: Money from several sources pooled together for budget and expenditure purposes. This is the largest single operational fund and includes a state appropriation for operations, student academic fee receipts and a small portion of federal indirect cost reimbursement. The fund number is 101.
MAJOR/OPTION:	The particular field in which a student has chosen to take concentrated work. Majors are recorded only for juniors, seniors and graduate students in this report.

NDC:	A Non-Degree Candidate in the graduate school is a student earning graduate credit who is not enrolled in a master's or doctoral program.
NON-GRADUATE:	A collective term for undergraduate degree students and undergraduate special students.
PART-TIME STUDENT:	A non-graduate student carrying less than 12 credits or a graduate student carrying less than 8 credits.
RESIDENT BY FEE:	A student assessed resident tuition and fees.
SPECIAL STUDENT:	A student earning undergraduate course credits who is not working towards a degree at UWM.
UNDERGRADUATE:	A collective term for freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors. Does not include special students.
YEAR IN SCHOOL:	The student's class standing (freshman, sophomore, etc.) based on credits earned in their academic area. Also called Year Status or Year in School.
