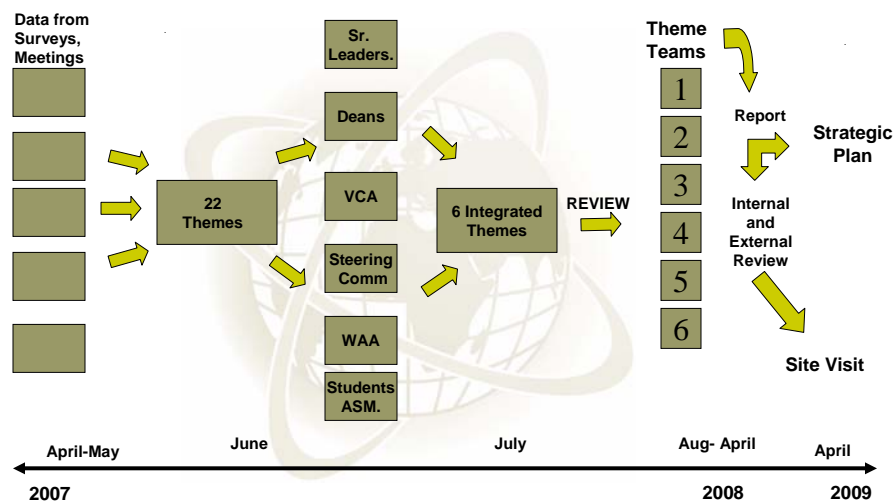

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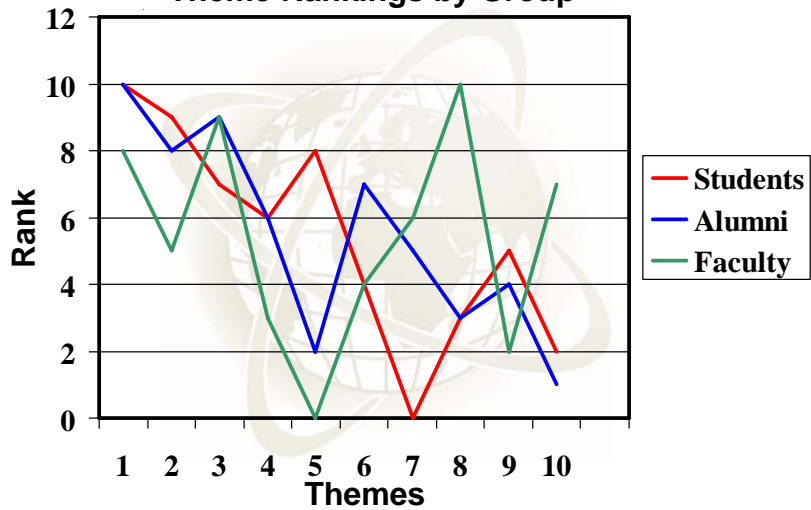

- How do we turn words into action and ensure that processes have integrity?



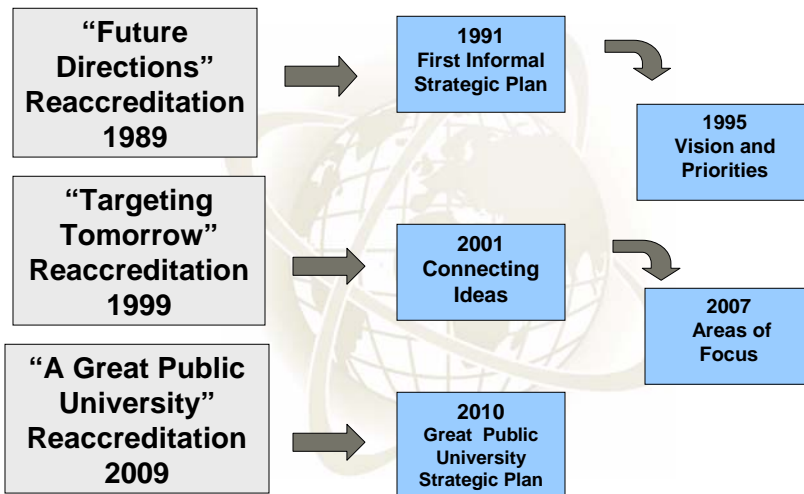
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Team #6 Institutional Integrity: Being a Responsible and Sustainable Public Institution
