

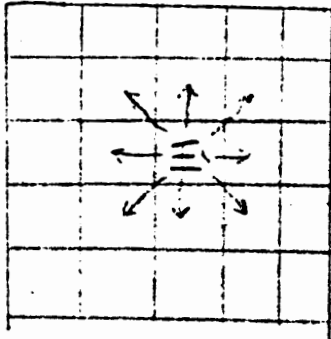

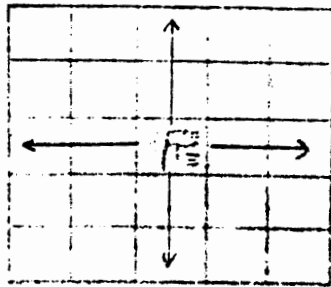

The Explanation of Japanese Chess Quiz

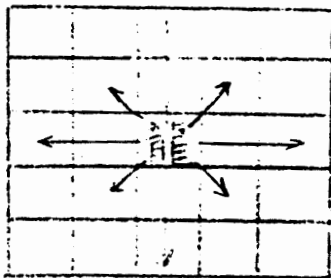
1. The Performance of the Japanese chessmen.



王 Gyoku = King

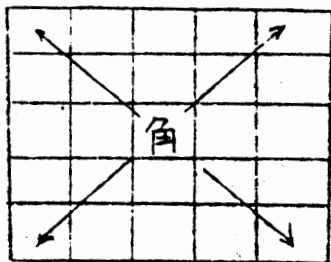


飛 Hisha

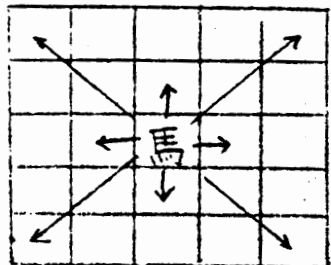


龍 Ryū = fantastic monstrous snake
