Periodical literature is the cutting edge of women's scholarship, feminist theory, and much of women's culture. Feminist Periodicals: A Current Listing of Contents is published by the Office of the University of Wisconsin System Gender & Women's Studies Librarian on a quarterly basis with the intent of increasing public visibility of feminist periodicals. It is our hope that Feminist Periodicals will serve several purposes: to keep the reader abreast of current topics in feminist literature; to increase readers' familiarity with a wide spectrum of feminist periodicals; and to provide the requisite bibliographic information should a reader wish to subscribe to a journal or to obtain a particular article at her library or through interlibrary loan.

Users will need to be aware of the limitations of copyright law with regard to photocopying of copyrighted materials.

Table of contents pages from current issues of major feminist journals are reproduced in each issue of Feminist Periodicals, followed by a comprehensive annotated listing of all journals we have selected. As publication schedules vary enormously, not every periodical will have table of contents pages reproduced in each issue of FP. The annotated listing provides the following information on each journal:

1. Year of first publication.
2. Frequency of publication.
3. Subscription prices (print only; for online prices, consult publisher).
4. Current editor.
5. Email address.
6. International Standard Serial Number (ISSN).
7. OCLC, Inc. Control Number.
8. Selected publications in which the journal is indexed.
9. Selected full text products in which publication appears or vendor intermediaries who make the full text available.
10. Subject focus/statement of purpose of the journal.

Please note that in the actual text, only the numbers 1 to 10 are used to identify the different categories of information.

Our goal in Feminist Periodicals is to represent English-language periodicals from around the world that focus on gender, women's studies, or women's issues. Generally, we do not include mainstream newsstand magazines. We are also unable to include periodicals that lack a complete table of contents. We encourage feminist serials to build a full table of contents into their regular format to facilitate possible inclusion in FP and indexing elsewhere.

The 1902 eruption of Mount Pelée is a powerful and enduring symbol in Martinican literature. In writings by white creole authors, the volcano's destruction of Saint-Pierre stands in as a symbol for the abolition of slavery and the loss of *béké* economic and political power. The novels *Cœurs martiniquais* and *Le Sang du volcan*, highlight complex and evolving relationships between white creole women and their *das*, and show both the gendered nature of colonial conquest and the blurring of color lines between Saint-Pierre's women on the eve of the volcanic eruption.

**On Rereading Mayotte Capécia Today***Michael Wiedorn* ..... 29

Why might the novelist Mayotte Capécia, who was a near-forgotten pariah in the fifty years since her work was published, have come to attract such vibrant critical attention today? Capécia was an object of scorn for Frantz Fanon, whose attack on her – or the person whom he took her to be – proved, despite Fanon's intentions, to preserve her work for future generations. A postmodern critique of the idea of the author *avant la lettre*, the name "Mayotte Capécia" was not a mere pseudonym; rather, it referred to an amalgam of writings and rewritings by a host of authors who all had different stakes in how her work would be received. Taking a sounding of the analyses of a host of contemporary critics, this article shows that Capécia's work merits rereading today, as her two novels offer a heretofore unseen portrait of her complex culture, of the political struggles within the French publishing industry of her time, and of the subject positionings of the critics who have spent so much ink excoriating her work.

**Mycéa : délire verbal et mémoire empierrée chez Édouard Glissant***Erika V. Serrato* ..... 41

Cet essai examine la manière dont Édouard Glissant présente le corps et l'esprit de la femme antillaise comme le champ de bataille où se jouent la problématique de l'Histoire, l'identité antillaise, et le rôle du langage, surtout par rapport à la



diglossie créole-français. Les ouvrages de Glissant révèlent une obsession avec l'Histoire. Cette hantise est due à l'indisponibilité d'une conception linéaire de l'Histoire aux Antilles et à l'impossibilité conséquente d'explorer une mémoire commune. Ses œuvres littéraires et théoriques traitent de la dépossession et du non-dit de ce qu'il appelle la « non-Histoire » des Antilles. Cette analyse prétend que Glissant présente le personnage de Marie Celat (Mycéa) et sa descente dans la folie pour illuminer le problème de l'Histoire non possédée des Antillais et pour générer un lien communautaire avec le passé. *La Case du commandeur* et « La folie Celat » dévoilent la folie comme la maladie ainsi que le remède des peuples colonisés des Antilles. La folie vouée de Mycéa sert de correctif par lequel l'héroïne rectifie les troubles (l'infanticide, l'oubli, etc.) de la première génération transplantée par force de l'Afrique aux îles caraïbes.

### ***L'Enfant-bois d'Audrey Pulvar : écriture d'une mémoire traumatique***

**Stève Puig** ..... 58

Premier roman d'Audrey Pulvar, *L'Enfant-bois* s'inscrit dans une généalogie littéraire tracée par les écrivains de la créolité mais également dans la tradition de romans publiés par des femmes de la diaspora noire, qu'elles écrivent de la Caraïbe ou des États-Unis. Cet article vise donc à souligner les influences de ces écrivains sur le roman de Pulvar et à analyser le thème du traumatisme individuel et collectif qui hante le roman de Pulvar et donne au texte un style particulier, faisant du roman une lente confession d'un passé douloureux.

### **« Il faut souffrir pour être belle » : constructions de la féminité dans *D'eaux douces* de Fabienne Kanor**

**Ann-Sofie Persson** ..... 68

L'objectif de l'article est de montrer comment le double discours patriarcal et colonialiste fonctionne dans le roman *D'Eaux douces* de Fabienne Kanor (2004) en s'interrogeant sur l'articulation des deux problématiques de la beauté et de la souffrance dans la formation identitaire de la femme martiniquaise de la seconde génération en France.

### **Espace océanique, parole archipélique et polyphonie mémorielle dans *Humus* de Fabienne Kanor**

**Emmanuel Bruno Jean-François**..... 77

Inscrit dans le contexte de la Traite négrière transatlantique, *Humus* de Fabienne Kanor restitue des voix oubliées par l'histoire : celles de femmes arrachées pour la plupart d'Afrique de l'ouest et transportées de force en 1774 à bord du négrier, *Le Soleil*, pour être réduites en esclavage dans les colonies américaines et les Caraïbes. En réinventant l'épisode de la traversée comme moment d'une affirmation de leur subjectivité subalterne, et en opposant leur cri de captives au journal technique et lacunaire du capitaine du bateau, la polyphonie mémorielle du roman révèle une version complexe et composite de l'histoire, suivant une esthétique de l'éclatement et de la fragmentation, qui est au principe de la parole archipélique. Ce que l'oralité littéraire et l'assemblage romanesque explorent alors, c'est en quoi le recouvrement des mémoires, l'entremêlement des vécus

intimes et l'articulation d'une conscience intersubjective tracent l'espace d'une solidarité et d'une résistance performatives, qui dévoient les absolus de l'histoire coloniale écrite de la seule perspective des puissants et des Européens.

## **Grandir femme dans *La Mazurka perdue des femmes-couresse* de Mérine Céco**

**Katia Gottin**..... 93

Cet article présente une analyse du roman *La Mazurka perdue des femmes-couresse*, publié en 2013 de l'auteure martiniquaise Mérine Céco, nom de plume de Corinne Mencé-Caster. Il s'intéresse plus spécifiquement aux conditions d'apprentissage d'une jeune femme antillaise en devenir dans un XXI<sup>e</sup> siècle globalisé et techno-centrique. Bien que le schéma narratif de ce roman martiniquais puisse s'identifier comme propre au roman d'apprentissage traditionnel, la structure narrative fragmentée atypique de ce texte complique notre lecture du trajet initiatique de la jeune Reine Surnom, de l'état d'adolescente antillaise à l'état de sujet féminin révolutionnaire. Le processus éducatif s'organise autour d'une transmission transgénérationnelle inscrivant ainsi ce roman dans une tradition littéraire féminine antillaise. Cependant, tout en exploitant ce genre littéraire, l'auteure en détourne les termes et expose un nouveau sujet femme fragmenté en quête d'une identité qui se définirait dans une relation conflictuelle entre passé et présent.

## **Portraying The Royal Self: Maurice-Quentin De La Tour's 1761 Portrait Of Marie-Josèphe Of Saxony And Her Son**

**Amanda Strasik**..... 108

My analysis of Maurice-Quentin de La Tour's *Portrait of Marie-Josèphe of Saxony and Her Son* (1761) in the context of Salic Law and eighteenth-century French gender politics suggests the future queen's negotiation of her own identity in royal portraiture. While the dauphine's representation adheres to rigidly structured codes of queenship in French art, I argue that Marie-Josèphe paradoxically sought to assert her selfhood amidst the depicted glory of the Bourbon dynasty. Likely to be the portrait's direct patron instead of the King's Household, Marie-Josèphe adopted sartorial and ideological elements from Jean-Marc Nattier's more private portrayal of Queen Marie Leszcinska (1748) to construct her image, suggesting a visual fellowship between royal women as they confronted gender constraints within French absolutism in art. Also, unlike most official portraits that formally represented royal sitters in oils, La Tour's more personal approach to painting through the intimacy of the pastel medium undermines the principles of royal portraiture to indicate a degree of the dauphine's agency. With imagery that falls in-between what was typical for official and private portraits of royalty, La Tour's pastel painting alludes to mounting ambiguities in representations of queenship in eighteenth-century France.

## Destabilizing Motherhood and Fostering Care in George Sand's *Les Maîtres Sonneurs*

Anne Marcoline ..... 119

This article draws from George Sand studies, motherhood studies, and feminist care ethics to show how Sand's representations of motherhood and the maternal in *Les Maîtres Sonneurs* (1853) destabilize and revise the patriarchal narrative of motherhood dominant in nineteenth-century France. Indeed, *Les Maîtres Sonneurs* offers a vision of motherhood that is unique even within Sand's own body of work: through Brulette's role as a foster mother, Sand weaves into the novel a counter apprentice story to that of Joseph, the bagpiper, in which she articulates motherhood as a difficult form of labor that does not come instinctively to Brulette. Further, Sand's novel condemns the emotional, moral, and physical violence against women that is grounded in rhetoric that simultaneously upholds motherhood as a natural, instinctive, sacred and civic duty and denigrates unwed mothers, with their *enfants naturels*, as unnatural and degenerate. In the process, there are in *Les Maîtres Sonneurs* moments of amazement that, I argue, function as an ethical space of relation within which the characters and the readers learn to bear witness as the mother figure negotiates her own identity vis-à-vis the child. These moments of amazement offer other characters and the reader the opportunity to enter into a new, more flexible and ethical relationship with the mother figure through a process of reevaluation of what might or might not be "natural" about motherhood. Finally, I propose that the novel ultimately pushes even further by shifting from a narrative about a nostalgic son's fantasy of motherhood, a Romantic fantasy that works to eclipse the mother, to a narrative that restores the mother with the help of the daughter.

## Unraveling the Feminist Novel of the Belle Époque: Gabrielle Réval's *La bachelière* (1910)

Hope Christiansen ..... 134

Experts on Belle Époque novels written by women regularly put Gabrielle Réval's *La bachelière* in the feminist category, but there is ample reason to challenge that classification. Many novels of this type feature a fiercely independent, ambitious heroine intent upon making a name for herself in a profession long dominated by men. What drives the plot is the conflict between her desire to find fulfillment outside the home and her lover's competing demand that she be satisfied with home (and him) alone, coupled with her own struggles to be successful in both spheres—that sometimes still elusive "work-life balance." Other constants include opposition from men in the workplace and support from female mentors. Réval builds *La bachelière* from these ingredients, but ultimately turns the recipe for the Belle Époque feminist novel on its head.

## Rereading Elsa Triolet's *Roses à crédit* as a Fairy Tale for Tough Financial Times

**Erin Tremblay Ponnou-Delaffon** ..... 149

Elsa Triolet's *Roses à crédit* (1959) tracks its heroine's discovery of the material pleasures of the postwar consumer boom. Yet, all is not "glorious" in the *Trente Glorieuses*, as *Roses à crédit* exposes the personal and social costs of societal transformation. Debt increasingly underwrites Martine's desires—until accounts must be settled, and reality forecloses upon her happiness. To understand how the novel taps into the socioeconomic and metaphysical anxieties of its times and indicts consumer capitalism's excesses, *Roses à crédit* can be read as weaving and unraveling the traditional fairy tale. In this modern tale, the "ogress" reality interrupts the enchantment of fiction, in the sense of both a marvelous plot and illusory riches. Triolet's narrative comes irrecoverably undone, shaking its protagonist's faith—in other words, her credence or credit—in money's ability to underwrite happiness. Ultimately, as I contend, *Roses à crédit* deploys and updates classic fairy tale conventions to craft a gendered critique of consumer capitalism for uncertain economic times—hers, and our own, both bound up in consumer cultures of credit and debt.

### **Annie Ernaux and *L'autre fille*: Writing Absence**

**Cathy Jellenik** ..... 160

Accepting the challenge issued by Claire Debru's recent collection (NiL Éditions, *Les Affranchis*), Annie Ernaux wrote the first letter of a series meant to emancipate authors from words that murmur within them but have yet to be uttered. In *L'autre fille*, Ernaux pens an epistle to a sister who had died at age six in 1940—two years before the author's birth. Having learned of her older sister's existence by sheer chance, Ernaux has spent a writing lifetime coming to terms with the absence in her family and to the annunciation that alerted her to it: "Elle était plus gentille que celle-là" (16). Creating of absence a presence, in *L'autre fille* Ernaux crafts a philosophy of literature that both clarifies and interrogates the literature that precedes it.

### **Femmes, violences et francophonie : des identités problématiques** **Véronique Tadjo et Tanella boni**

**Sabrina Medouda** ..... 172

Cet article met en relation les notions de féminité, de violence et de francophonie. Il s'agira de mettre en lumière la violence plurielle subie par les identités fluides présentes au fil des œuvres poétiques et romanesques des auteures ivoiriennes Tanella Boni et Véronique Tadjo. Dans ces écritures de l'exil, les personnages refusent ou transgressent les normes établies et, par-là, renforcent la marge dans laquelle le système les place du fait de leur genre ou de leurs choix de vie. Ce travail montre en quoi ces personnages deviennent problématiques pour l'ordre établi et de quelle manière leur fluidité donne au texte une note contestataire au féminin.
