Summary:	This collection includes course materials from Siefert's courses on civil and highway technology, drafting, dynamics, excavation, machine design, map reading, surveying and topography.

Biographical Note

Edwin W. Siefert was born September 20, 1914. He attended high school in Menomonie, Wisconsin and graduated from the Stout Institute in 1936. He later received his M.Ed. degree from Wayne State University in 1945. He returned to Stout in 1950 as an assistant professor of machine drafting through the Department of Graphic Communications. During his career at Stout he taught topography, machine mechanical design, and general drafting. While at Stout, as a licensed Wisconsin land surveyor, he

conducted the Mapping Institute at Pigeon Lake and was active in the Wisconsin Society of Land Surveyors. He retired in 1979.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains handouts, lecture notes, course outlines and tests by Siefert for classes in civil and highway technology, drafting, dynamics, excavation, machine design, map reading, surveying and topography. In addition, there are papers related to Siefert's involvement with the Mapping Institute of Pigeon Lake and the Northwest Wisconsin Chapter of the Society of Land Surveyors Seminar. Also included are speeches and papers presented by Siefert at various conferences and seminars. The bulk of the material spans the period 1960-1978.
